Mr. Chiedu Osakwe Is Appointed Director General/ Chief Negotiator of Nigerian Office for Trade Negotiations (NOTN) The Federal Government of Nigeria has approved the appointment of Mr. Chiedu Osakwe as Director General with concurrent designation as Chief Negotiator, Nigerian Office for Trade Negotiations (NOTN) for a period of four years.
- 2. Nigeria and United Nations Sign Sustainable Development Partnership Framework (UNSDPF) [2018-2022]

 Nigeria and the United Nations (UN) have signed a five-year Sustainable Development Partnership Framework (UNSDPF) [2018-2022], which is a successor programme to the current United Nations Development Assistance Framework III (UNDAF III) (2014-2017) in Nigeria. The UNSDPF has three strategic priority result areas which are governance, human rights, peace and security; equitable quality basic services and sustainable and inclusive economic development.
- 3. Nigeria Begins Issuance of Temporary Work Permit Via Email According to the Comptroller-General of the Nigeria Immigration Service (NIS), Muhammad Babandede, Nigeria has started issuance of Temporary Work Permit (TWP), Visa by e-mail to expatriates coming to the country for temporary work.
 - This is part of the ongoing automation of the service' operations and in line with the Ease of Doing Business in Nigeria.
- 4. Turkish Cargo Launch Freighter Between Istanbul and Kano Istanbul-based Turkish Cargo has introduced a new route by launching freighter between Istanbul and Kano. Turkish Cargo currently operates services to 120 countries.
 - The new Kano flight will be via Dakar. This will be the second destination after Lagos in Nigeria to which Turkish Cargo will operate cargo flights. Kano stands out with its processed leather products.
- 5. Nigeria Assumes Chairmanship of AU-PSC for July 2017
 Nigeria has emerged the chair of the African Union Peace and Security Council (AU-PSC) for the month of July 2017. Nigeria's Permanent Representative to the AU, Mr. Bankole Adeoye, took over from Mr. Susan Sikaneta, the Permanent Representative of Zambia, who held the Presidency for the month of June.
